

Please join us for a wonderful way to start the day.



Student Absences

If your child is away from school for any reason it is important that you contact the school to provide a reason. Information is recorded electronically by the Department of Education to monitor absences. Parents are now required to provide a medical certificate for students who are absent with illnesses for 5 or more days in a calendar year.

Student Medications

If a student requires medication whilst at school, please discuss with your child's teacher and school administration staff to ensure that school staff are clearly advised on how to administer the medication.

Written permission (Education Department Medication Form) must be provided for any non-prescribed (e.g. Panadol) or prescribed medication to be taken by your child. Medication must be given to the school in its original packaging. The form for prescribed medication must be signed by the doctor or chemist who administers the prescription.

Education Department Medication Forms are available at the school office.



Fidget Quilts

In Term 2, we have the 2019 Tasmanian Australian of the Year recipients coming to speak with students about their achievements and how to make a difference in their community.

The 2019 Tasmanian Local Hero recipient, Vicki Purnell is a sewing guru that founded Bridies Blossoms and Blessings as well as making fidget quilts for dementia patients which she donates to the Launceston General Hospital. Fidget/activity quilts are composed of assorted textured fabrics with many objects such as lace, zippers, beads, braids, cords, keys, elastic hair ties, plastic cat toys etc. securely attached. Designed to sit on a lap, fidget quilts provide a soothing and calming experience for those living with dementia. The textures and movable components provide a sensory stimulus for hands that become increasingly restless and fidgety, hence the fidget quilt name. The gentle repetitive nature of the tactile components enhances the quality of life for the patient by stimulating memories and curiosity.

Fidget quilts have proven invaluable in our hospital environment in Tasmania especially when patients with dementia find themselves in unfamiliar and overwhelming situations such as the emergency department. Fidget quilts given to patients in our hospitals remain with them during their stay and then accompany them when they return to their home environment.

Help Vicki put together the next lot fidget quilts by bringing in any old bits and bobs you have lying around such as zips, ribbons, buttons, hair ties, patterned fabrics, beads, keys or basically anything that could be attached by a piece of string or fabric. These quilts will then start to be put together in a fidget quilt workshop held at Collegiate College in Hobart before being donated to hospitals around the state. Please bring any items you wish to donate to Vicki to the front office by Tuesday 28th May 2019.
