

This year we have two obvious forms of student leadership in our school:






Learning about our families in Kinder Bilby!













This term in Kinder Bilby we are doing an inquiry unit about community connections. As part of our inquiry we are looking at special people, places, symbols, and animals in our community.


This unit strongly links with outcomes in Belonging, Being and Becoming: The Early Years Learning Framework for Australia:

Throughout the unit we will be asking questions, sharing understanding and communicating our understanding about our community.





REMINDER

Town Services

All Students who start and end their travel within the town boundary (Armour Mitre 10, Tall Timbers Round-a-bout or Mella Turn off), are required, by Department of State Growth—Passenger Transport to pay a fare to travel.

This means that a student who gets on at Smithton Primary in the afternoon and travels to Smithton High, Dance Studio, After School Care, or home, all must pay to use the service. The same rules apply in the mornings.

Depending on where you are travelling to, you may need to use a different bus to your regular bus.

The cost is \$1.80 per student, per trip; or \$14.40 for a sheet of 10 tickets, or you may be entitled to free travel.
