

Numeracy Priority

You may remember that this year one of our areas for improvement is in the area of Numeracy/Mathematics. We have enlisted the support and help from two staff from within the Department of Education, Ben Johnson and Toni Popowski. They have already been working with our staff and are continuing that work this week. Last week, four of our staff also were able to go away to a Professional Learning Day in Launceston where they were

able to learn from a Maths expert, Di Siemens. This was a really good opportunity for our staff to be able to 'learn from the best' and ultimately means better teaching and learning going on in our classrooms.



External Review



This week our school has been under its four-yearly review. This is a process where a panel of ex-Principals come into the school to gain information about how the school is going and what recommendations they have for future improvement. This is a really useful and helpful tool for our school to be able to put plans in place for the future. One thing that shone through the External Review was our major theme of 'TEAM' and the fact that we are inclusive of everyone. One of the panel members expressed that our school is "one of the most welcoming schools they have been in." The panel expressed that our staff really support one another and that across the whole school we have people who want to

improve and learn. There are some areas for improvement for us as a school that are in agreement with most of the plans we have in place already, so that was really good to know. Moderation Day

As you would already be aware, Thursday Ist of April is a student free day. This is across the whole cluster and wider within Department of Education schools. We do this so that we can engage in a day of moderation. You may have wondered what this means? Basically, all teachers teaching in the same year levels have given their students the same task to complete. The teacher will then assess this task as they usually would. The teacher then brings their tasks and the assessments to be moderated with other teachers from the other schools. They then look at one another's tasks and assess them to see if each

teacher is assessing the same way as them or if they are being too hard or too soft with their marking. We do this in small groups of teachers in Numeracy and Literacy. This is our way of ensuring that all students in all schools in all year levels are receiving assessments that are correct and fair. The process is for the teachers to improve.



Mentoring

We are continuing to have some positive experiences going on with our mentors at Smithton Primary. We have eight mentors who are coming in for various lengths of time to spend one-on-one time and time in small groups with students, giving them someone who will encourage them.

Thanks once again for your ongoing support. As has been said many times over the last 18 months, at Smithton Primary School we work together so that everyone achieves more. 


2/3 Goodwin


