
In 3/4 Irvine we have been learning about Borneo and the animals that live there, particularly orangutans. We have a wondering wall with questions that we are curious about. So far, we have discovered:

- Orangutans have 32 teeth
- The oldest orangutan lived to 61, but usually they live between 35 and 45 years
- An orangutan's grip is four times stronger than a human's
- Orangutans only have one baby at a time
- We share about 97% of our DNA with orangutans
- The largest terrestrial animal in Borneo is a pygmy elephant
- Orangutans build nests each night, but they don't share them
- Orangutans can swim
- Sumatran orangutans can grow between 1.4 and 1.8 metres tall, but Bornean orangutans are smaller
- Orangutans' main source of diet is fruit and leaves from rainforest trees. They also eat bark, insects and on rare occasions, meat.
- An orangutan's main predator is a clouded leopard
- Orangutans are endangered which means that they might become extinct
- Borneo is 130 million years old
- The population of wild orangutans is somewhere between 55 000 and 65 000
- There are 222 different species of mammals living in Borneo
- Siamese Crocodiles live in Borneo






Prep-1 Grey






What is Reconciliation?
