-WELCOME-BACK TO SCHOOL

We have had a wonderful start back at school for 2022 with students very keen to see one another and return to learning. Families have done a wonderful job of preparing their children, especially given the fact that we have some changes to keep us safe at school and in the community. As you know, the Department of Education (DoE) is working closely with Public Health to provide us with the best up to date advice on how to operate the school safely. So as a result, at school we are:

- all staff and visitors (including parents) are wearing face masks.
- opening windows and doors for ventilation and air purifiers are in every learning area.
- frequently cleaning and increasing hygiene practices washing hands and sanitising.
- all staff (including contractors onsite) are vaccinated and are checking in using the app.
- limiting extra adults on site.
- using outdoor learning spaces.
- Limiting opportunities for large gatherings of people to occur and mix.

I really appreciate the way that our parents and staff are following the rules that we are asking you to do. I understand that not everyone agrees with all of the rules, however it is great to see people being respectful of alternative views. We have already had the opportunity to test out some of our systems with some students having to isolate due to being a close contact. We have also had staff in this situation and it is brilliant to see the flexibility people are showing when adjustments need to be made.

Over the next few weeks our teachers will be making initial contact with families to discuss the start of the year, students learning goals, students interests and strengths! This is a great opportunity for teachers and families to work together for the best possible learning outcomes for our students.

Again, I wish to thank the school community for their ongoing support of the improvements we are making at Smithton Primary School. I especially thank you for your flexibility and patience as we follow the *DoE Return to School Plan*. Everyone needs to roll their dice.


If the number comes up, they take those dice out of the game.

How to do a nasal rapid antigen test (RAT)



There are different types of RAT kits available. Be sure to follow the instructions provided within the test kit.

Here are some general guidelines to follow:

Carefully read the instructions that came with your test before you start.
 Some test instructions have a QR code that you can scan to watch a video.



2. Wash your hands.



Open packaging.



4. Wipe the swab around the inside wall of the nose 2cm deep in a circular motion. Five times or 15 seconds in



5. Put swab in solution tube. Mix well. You may need to squeeze the swab or break the stick off as well read your test instructions.



Put cap on tube.



 Put drops in sample window of test. Your test kit instructions will tell you how many drops. Do not move or lift the test kit.



 Start a timer. Wait for exact time in test kit instructions. Do not move or lift sample window of test.

If there is a COVID-19 case in your child's class-room, monitor your child for symptoms.



If they're unwell, use the rapid antigen tests (RATs) provided by your school.



If your child is a close contact, they must follow Public Health advice for close contacts.



If your child needs to isolate, their learning will be supported online.

Student Absences

If your child is away from school for any reason it is important that you contact the school to provide a reason. Information is recorded electronically by the Department of Education to monitor absences. Parents may be required to provide a medical certificate for students who are absent with illnesses for 5 or more days in a calendar year.

- Reply to the absence text sent by the school
- Send a written note to the school office
- Email the school on <u>smithton.primary@education.tas.gov.au</u> on the day your child is away

Student Medications

If a student requires medication whilst at school, please discuss with your child's teacher and school administration staff to ensure that school staff are clearly advised on how to administer the medication.

Written permission (Education Department Medication Form) must be provided for any non-prescribed (e.g. Panadol) or prescribed medication to be taken by your child. Medication must be given to the school in its original packaging. The form for prescribed medication must be signed by the doctor or chemist who administers the prescription.

Education Department Medication Forms are available at the school office.
