# 2/3 Goodwin

Grade 2/3 Goodwin were straight back into learning after the holidays. We are learning about all types of shapes, their names and if they are 2D or 3D. We explored what the features are and how we see shapes all around us.

We used recyclable materials to create our own town with a focus of building and designing each structure using as many different shapes as we could. We recreated McCains, a treehouse, take away shops and houses. Some of our buildings had triangular or round windows, rectangular or square doors and included many features such as trapdoors, second stories and of course many shaped hot chips from McCains.













What a fantastic start to the term we have had here at SPS. It has been so good to see students settling back into the routines of school and enjoying being back with their friends. This term, we have some things to look forward to including Walk to School Day (20<sup>th</sup> May), National Simultaneous Story Time (25<sup>th</sup> May), School Photos (8<sup>th</sup> June) and some specialist clinics in PE among other things.

#### NAPLAN

This fortnight we have our Year 3 and 5 students undertaking NAPLAN testing, which is a test that is completed in all schools in Australia. The students are tested on Reading, Writing, Numeracy, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation. The general public and the media generally make a fairly big deal about this testing, which I believe is unhelpful as it creates fear and panic for families. At Smithton Primary School, we understand that single testing of students at one point in time and on one day only gives you a small piece of information. So rather than use this data in a huge way to assess individual students, what we do is look for trends in our student's data to see if there are areas that our students struggle with, so that we can improve our teaching in these areas. It is also a good opportunity for us as a school to observe areas of strength. So please, if your child is undertaking NAPLAN, all we ask is that they do their best because that will give us the information we need to improve as a whole school.

#### Covid

Although we continue to have some COVID restrictions around how we run the school, it is great that as a school we can find ways to continue to feel like we are connected to one another. Some of the things to note for Term 2 in regard to COVID restrictions include:

- I. Attendance: Students should be at school unless they are unwell or have COVID-19 symptoms. They can also stay away of they have medical advice that states they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition. They can also stay home if they have been directed by Public Health to do so.
- 2. Launching into Learning (LiL): We are now able to have LiL inside which means we can now offer two sessions (one session on Friday at 9:00am and one session on Tuesday at 11am). Mrs Melissa Coombe will be running both sessions and the details are posted on our Facebook page. To attend these sessions, come through the office area to sign in.
- 3. *Masks:* All staff and other adults will continue to wear masks onsite. Students in Primary School are not required to wear masks but can do if their families wish for them to do so.
- 4. Assemblies: We are not able to have Assemblies inside or outside in Term 2.
- 5. Adults onsite: We will continue to limit the number of adults onsite. However, we will be allowing pre-organised meetings and learning opportunities to start up in Term 2.

#### School Drop Off

We continue to ask families to do all they can to limit their time onsite at drop off times. You have all been doing a great job of this. I also would like to remind all adults to make sure you have a mask on when you are at school. We understand that it is difficult to remember (as they are not required to be worn anymore in many places), but it is a requirement that we have.

#### Reporting

This term we also have our first real use of a new reporting system that the Department of Education have formulated. You will read more about this in our next newsletter as we work hard to inform you on the progress your child/ren are making with their learning.

#### Cross Country

Finally, it is looking like Cross Country can go ahead. As a group of Principal's in CH, we will make some decisions around how our Cross Country Carnivals will be ran so that all schools are consistent in the way they do Cross Country. There will be more information coming out soon.

I continue to thank families for continuing to work with us and communicating important information with us. If you ever need to discuss a question, idea, success or concern; please make a time to meet with myself or your child's teacher.






# Student drop off and pick up

## Managing COVID-19 in schools

This term, there will be some changes in how COVID-19 cases are managed in schools.

Our school will continue to work closely with Public Health to safely manage any COVID-19 cases, with a focus on testing students and staff who have symptoms.

The number of students and staff with COVID-19 will be closely monitored, and we will work with Public Health to respond as needed. If there's an increase in cases, Public Health will tell us what we need to do and what actions families will need to take.

Parents and carers will no longer receive a message every time there is an individual case in a class or grade – unless students or staff are medically vulnerable.

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### Changes to close contact requirements

Public Health has recently changed the rules for close contacts of COVID-19 cases so that they no longer need to isolate.

This means that if your child is a close contact – and importantly, symptom-free – they can attend school (except for support schools).

They would however need to pass a daily rapid antigen test before leaving home each day, for a seven-day period. Advice for close contacts is available on the <u>Tasmanian Government Coronavirus website</u>.

You will only need to let us know if your child is a close contact if they're not attending school.

Close contacts should practise COVID-safe behaviours including good hand hygiene, physically distancing from others when they can and staying away from school if they have any symptoms.

While primary aged close contacts are not obliged to wear a mask in school, they can still choose to if it is practicable for them and they are happy to do so.

If your child is medically vulnerable and you have concerns with the changes to close contacts, then you may wish to work with your child's medical practitioner to identify further options to reduce the risk of COVID-19 to them. If you have any concerns, please talk to us about alternative learning options.
