


KOALA INQUIRY IN PREP GALE

In Prep we have been learning about the differences between Fiction and Facts.





Walk Safely to School Day

Last Friday morning (20th May) our school had over 60 students and a large number of adults gather at meeting points in Smithton to walk to school. This was for "Walk Safely to School Day" which is about sending a clear message to our families around being safe near the roads. Some specific messages that we as a school want our families to know is that we require everyone who crosses Grant Street before or after school to use the official crossing and then enter the school using the footpaths (not across the carpark). Any student riding a

bike or scooter to school is required to be wearing a helmet. Our school in particular is a really busy place before and after school and so we each need to do our bit to keep everyone safe.

Cross Country

With COVID19 restrictions easing, Cross Country is now something that we are able to run from K-6 with families attending. A letter has gone home outlining the details.

Early Childhood Cross Country (Kinder to Year 2) will be held on Wednesday Ist of June, commencing at 9:15am. The Year 3/4 Cross Country will occur on Friday 3rd June, starting at 11:30am. The Year 5/6 Cross Country will occur on Thursday 2nd June, starting at 11:30am.

Families may attend this outdoor event being held outside at the back of the gym. If you wish to attend, bring your mask (which must be worn inside), enter and sign in through the office area... you are most welcome.

School Improvement Plan

Each year our school (and every school) has a School Improvement Plan. This is based on what our data is telling us about areas we need to make improvements in. Although we will share more details of this, this year we are split into two areas:

- 1. Improve student engagement for learning we are looking at things we can do inside the classroom and outside the classroom that will make students feel more eager to be at SPS and keen to be learning.
- 2. Strengthen the collaborative processes within the school we are looking at ways that our staff can work more effectively together so that we can all improve as a TEAM.

The **ZONES** of Regulation®

Every environment has a set of unwritten social rules that people are expected to follow such as talking when it is your turn and respecting personal space. These 'hidden rules' are often not talked about. When people follow these social rules they are doing what is expected. Doing what is expected means understanding or figuring out those hidden rules and aligning our behaviour (what we say and do) with the expectations of the situation. When people follow the hidden rules and do what is expected it leads others to have positive thoughts and feel comfortable.

Unexpected behaviours are actions which do not follow the 'hidden rules.' These behaviours can surprise other people and make them feel uncomfortable or confused. For example, the hidden rule at a birthday party is that the birthday girl or boy opens the gifts. If a guest at the party opened the gift that might make people feel uncomfortable.

This concept of expected and unexpected behaviours can help children develop an understanding that their behaviour and actions impacts other people.

Is this expected or unexpected behaviour?
