
I know it is fair to say that both Miss Latimer and Miss Irvine will be very much missed by our whole school community, and we wish them both well for their future!

We have made songs as a whole class, based on a theme like 'rain' or 'spring', using lots of percussive instruments, as well as making our own melodies in small groups on the xylophones.

5/6 Squire


Term 3 has been another big term for 5/6 Squire. Students spent time learning about gases, liquids and solids in Science and had fun investigating the properties of each during our Science Day. The class also had great success at the Science Week Science Gig, winning the class challenge with our investigations of the use and properties of glass. We presented work on our mini biomes we made in recycled jars in Term 1 and reported on the way the water cycle works within a closed system terrarium.

It has also been a physically challenging term with colds and flus, and we have had winter sports, athletics, footy, rugby clinic and Country Gold to help us enjoy the colder season. Book Week and Father's Day gift making were also lots of fun, as were the arrival of our class pets Pebble and B2 the bunnies.

The death of Queen Elizabeth II was a sad but important event for us to recognise and prompted discussion about the way countries are governed, the role of leaders and commitment to service. This has flowed into discussions about the creation of laws and the way in which rules and laws create a safer, fairer and more equitable society.

In Banqer, some students have been investigating ways they could create a business and how they will promote their business within the class. Students have created a chair stacking business, a custom chatterbox business and others have been considering services like pencil sharpening and desk clearing. Considering the differences between providing services and sales, and in conducting some in class market research to determine which kind of business students want to develop has been a focal point for our discussions.














How do you know your child may have a hearing loss as opposed to "selective hearing" when you are trying to get them to do a household chore?

- Does not follow simple commands, such as "get your shoes," or understand simple directions
- Is easily frustrated or experiences communication breakdowns
- Is falling behind with speech and communication skills
- Cannot understand what you are saying unless they are looking directly at you
- Cannot identify where sounds are coming from
- Is exhausted at the end of school from concentrating to understand speech
- Shows signs of behavioural problems or social difficulties
- Experiences problems keeping up at school or grades slipping
- Does not respond to you/others from a distance
- Has delays in speech and language development

Remember that the impact of hearing loss on a developing child is quite different from the effects of hearing loss that occur in adulthood.

Children use their hearing to learn about the world around them and develop communication skills. Any impact on their hearing means those developing skills will also be impacted.

If you would like your child's hearing tested, let their teacher know and they will arrange for Nurse Rob to assess your child's hearing at school.
