ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR FREE STUDENT BUS TRAVEL?

If you are 18 or under, study full time in a recognised Tasmanian education facility and meet certain criteria, you may be eligible for free bus travel or transfers to get to and from school.

If eligible and you apply before Friday, 6 January 2023 you will receive your student bus pass for free travel before the start of Term I.

If you already have a student bus pass for free travel and you're still eligible for free travel in 2023, you will be able to access your free travel entitlement with your existing card.
