will be a good opportunity for the whole school community to come together to celebrate a fantastic start to the year.







Maths in 3/4 Underwood



Below are some of the activities we have been doing during our Math Rotations.
















Eye Assessment

Poor eyesight can cause learning and behavioural problems, which might be blamed on other things. This is especially true for young children, who may find it difficult to explain the difficulties they are having with their eyesight. They may not even be aware they have a problem at all.

The sooner that vision problems are detected, the better the outcome. Conditions such as squint and amblyopia (lazy eye) can be treated more effectively if they are picked up earlier, and that could make huge difference to your child.

What things to look out for

It's often difficult to tell whether your child has sight problems, which is why regular eye tests are so important. However, there are a number of things to look out for:

- Straining their eyes or tilting their head to see better
- Frequent eye rubbing
- Losing their place while reading, or using a finger to guide their eyes
- Sensitivity to light and/or excessive tearing
- Falling behind in school
- · Complaining of headaches or tired eyes
- Consistently sitting too close to the TV or holding a book too close
- Avoiding activities which require near vision such as reading or homework, or distance vision such as participating in sports or other recreational activities
- Closing one eye to read, watch TV or see better
- Avoiding using a computer or tablet because it 'hurts their eyes'
- The presence of a 'turn' in the eye or a misdirection of the eyes
- A 'white reflex' in photographs. This is similar in appearance to red-eye, except it's white. It is extremely serious if you notice it, you should seek medical attention immediately.

If you would like your child's eyes tested, let their teacher know and they will arrange for Nurse Rob to assess your child's eyesight at school.
