This term we have a lot to look forward to. Our Year 5/6 students have Winter Sport starting this Friday. This is where we come together with the other Circular Head Cluster Schools to play a variety of sports (Football, Hockey, Taekwondo, Basketball and Netball). From this, the Country Gold team get's selected to represent the whole of Circular Head in Launceston, competing against schools from around the northern part of the state. Similarly, our Year 3/4 students get a taster of this with the 3/4 Expo where our student mix with other students from other schools, playing a variety of sports.

We will also have our Maths Relays running this term, where students will initially compete in some friendly competition withinour own school. Our top performers will be selected to compete in the Circular Head Cluster Maths Relay.

Very soon will also be the Science Gig, this is an annual event that we encourage our students (and their families) to attend at the Circular Head Rec. This is held on Monday 14th of August from 4:30 – 8:00pm. I encourage you to go along, even if it is just for half an hour, to look at what is happening in the area of Science in our community.

On the 23rd of August at 9:10am, we will be having our Book Parade, where students can come dressed up as a character from a book. We will give everyone the chance to 'parade' in our annual catwalk event, which is a bit of fun and more importantly it celebrates reading and books. Considering that improving our reading is one of the school's two priorities, this will be a very special event that all families are welcome to come and watch.

Lastly, we end the term with our Early Childhood Swimming campaign. It will be a big week, but a very important week. We all know how important it is that our children learn to swim, so we will make the most of that opportunity.

Incontinence in Children

Children usually develop the ability to be toilet trained about 3 years of age. If children aged 4 years and over are unable to be toilet trained or experience regular incontinence, advice from a health professional is recommended.

The bladder is an organ that stores urine (wee). In Australia, 1 in 5 children have a bladder control problem.

Signs of a healthy bladder include it empties 4-6 times a day; can hold up to 400-600ml of urine; may wake you up once at night to pass urine, tells you when it is full but gives you enough time to find a toilet; empties completely each time you pass urine; does not leak urine.

Types of incontinence in children:

- <u>Daytime Wetting</u>- the loss of bladder control during the day, usually caused because the bladder is not working properly. It is NOT caused by attention-seeking, naughtiness or laziness.
- <u>Bedwetting-</u> this happens when the bladder involuntarily empties during the night. Most children will be dry at night by school age. Some children may experience accidents until 7 or 8 years.

It is important to seek professional help for bedwetting if:

- your child starts wetting at night after being dry
- the wetting is frequent after school age
- the wetting bothers the child or makes them upset
- the child wants to become dry.
- <u>Soiling</u>-is when the bowels are emptied in places other than the toilet. It usually happens because the large bowel in not emptying properly and the child is constipated.
