We've had an excellent start to Term 3 with a lot of amazing learning opportunities being provided throughout the school.

August - SMA Awareness Month

If you have been keeping an eye on us on Facebook you would have noticed that we have had a focus over the August month of SMA (Spinal Muscular Atrophy) and we have raised funds and awareness for the charity "Move 4 Bella." This charity was suggested to us by Mrs Maddie Gale, whose son Vann was born with SMA. Classes have utilised the book "Zac's Play Day" (a book written to teach students about SMA) that was donated to the school by the Gale Family. So far we have raised \$503.15 that has been sent to Move 4 Bella.



Science Week

With this week being Science Week, it was great to see some of our students undertake the Science Trail in town, place entries into the Science Gig Competition and attend the Science Gig. It is a particularly big task for our staff to get entries together for this, so I would like to acknowledge the extra work that was put in by staff to make this happen. Some of our students were recognised on Monday night at the Science Gig and we congratulate them too.

Excursions

We have had several excursions continuing on throughout the school with all of our Year 3/4 students heading out to the Duck River Meadows Robotic Dry to learn more about how this technology is used in the dairy industry. One of the highlights for these groups was the cheese tasting! Our Preps had the chance to head out to a dairy farm to spend some time with newly born calves and we thank Annisa, Dairy Tas, Ag Warehouse, Yolla Co-op, Elders and De Lavel for making this happen. We have had an 'incursion' with Robot Man coming for a visit to our school to share his love of technology with our students. Our students were inspired and motivated to learn more about this aspect of STEAM.






3-4 Gausden














Claire Ann Taylor & Smithton Primary students
