Year 3/4 Johnston – Term 4 2023

This term 3/4 J have been preparing for our class café. The class decided to call it 'The Busy Bee Café'. We've had a lot of fun creating and trying out different things.



In English, students have been learning about procedural texts so they have created a number of items where they have used the structure and language features of a procedure. The items they have created include invitations and menus for the cafe. The students then had a choice to create a set of instructions for either hopscotch or a treasure map.

In Maths we have been learning fractions, money and time. These all link in with our café as these concepts can be linked to authentic learning. The students had to use fractions in the recipes for cooking, money scenarios about costing and giving change (if we charged for menu items). Time was important as students needed to work out how much time we would need for cooking, playing games and welcoming parents and carers to the café.

Science has been an adventure in discovering the working of bees and their connection to the environment and their role in a food chain. In our café, we cooked using honey.

Student Wellbeing and Engagement Data

Looking through our Student Wellbeing and Engagement data, it has been pleasing to see us making growth. The summary of the data shows that our students are feeling safer at school, there is less verbal bullying and a huge improvement in cyberbullying. Our students are happier, have better satisfaction in life, are less worried, have grown in perseverance and feel that they belong more at school. This is in comparison to last year and the previous two years before that. We also identified that we have some work to do in the area of peer belonging and social bullying, which we will do in 2024. Keep in mind that the survey (conducted state-wide and is mandatory for schools to do) only asks our Year 4-6s, so we haven't got the voice of our younger students in this data.

We finished off with a sausage sizzle and a surprise Zooper Dooper.















Student fare increase









Student bus fares will increase on 1 January 2024. The new fare will be:

- \$1.60 if using a smartcard or 10-trip ticket
- \$2.00 if paying cash for a single trip

The student fare applies regardless of distance, area of travel, or day of the week, including school holidays.

Some students will be eligible for free travel to and from school.

Department of State Growth

The full student fare will increase by 10 cents on 1 January

If you use cash for a single trip ticket, the new fare will be

If you use a smart card or purchase a 10-trip ticket, the new fare will be \$1.60.

Smartcards, like Greencard and Transportme can be topped up online. You can buy a 10-trip ticket for \$16.00

It costs the same on every trip - it doesn't matter how far, where, or when you go. Bus routes that travel only in a rural area, to the local school, don't charge a fare.

Some students can travel or transfer between buses for free. You may be eligible for a Student Bus Pass for Free Travel if you are:

- Listed on a Health Care or Pensioner Card
- Travel wholly within the rural area where there is only a fare charging service
- Must use more than one bus between home and school and/or school and home
- Are under a Care and Protection Order

The student fare last increased in 2022. This fare increase is set by government policy.

Staff from Services Australia travel with the Mobile Service Centres and can help you with Centrelink and Medicare payments and services. Our Mobile Service Centres also have disabled access.

Information about Department of Veterans' Affairs programs and support services for veterans and their families will also be available.

Wi-Fi is available for visitors to the Mobile Service Centre and staff will be able to help you create a myGov account. myGov is a simple and secure way to access government services online.

Our staff will provide you with friendly face-to-face service, information and support. From time to time, representatives from other government agencies also travel with the Mobile Service Centres.
