#### Dear families,



I want to now show you some data to highlight some things. Below are four graphs and I want to explain them.


**School Belonging** (Feeling positively connected to the school) has increased significantly and we are well above other schools.

**School Climate** (the overall tone of the school) has also increased and we are now caught up to the average for schools our size where only two years ago we were well behind.

Cognitive Engagement (persistence of students in the classroom) has also risen.

**Overall School Rating** (averaging all of our school data) shows that we are in Q4 which means we have had recent achievement and that is on a 5-year trend. Our school has been in Q1 for many years and so it is great to see that we are now out of that area and in the area that all schools strive to be in.





From my point of view, whilst this data is fantastic, we cannot slow down. We need to continue to improve, because the focus is always on the students and their learning. It is all about them. And what we know about our students is that they are real people with real lives to live... they are not just numbers on a page. They are amazing and so much potential. Our job is to continue to improve as a school so that these students get the best possible chance of living the best life they can have. # **Asthma Ready for School**



Summer holidays are an important time for kids with asthma

During all the festivities, please don't forget to keep up your child's asthma management and continue to use their asthma medication as prescribed. Good asthma management over the holidays means less time off school when kids return in the new year, and less time off work for you.

To make sure your child stays as healthy as possible over the break and into 2024, you can take the following steps:

- Check your child's medication to make sure they're still in date.
- Keep using your child's preventer medication as directed over the summer holidays, even if they're feeling well
- If you're leaving the house or going on holiday, make sure you pack your child's asthma medication(s) and a spacer.

- Book an Asthma Review with your doctor to get an updated written Asthma Action Plan during the holidays-you'll need this for Term 1 2023. Book in early as doctors can have limited appointments over the Christmas period.

## BACK TO SCHOOL... IS YOUR CHILD ASTHMA READY?

Every year there is a rise in a sthma flare-ups when children return to school after the summer holidays.

#### MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS ASTHMA READY BY FOLLOWING THESE STEPS:

This results in an increase in Emergency Department visits, hospitalisations and days off school.

## BOOK AN ASTHMA REVIEW (LONG APPOINTMENT)

This is a special check-up for your child's asthma, recent asthma control, symptoms, summer and back to school triggers, and medicine use. Don't forget to include a check on their device technique.



## UPDATE YOUR CHILD'S ASTHMA ACTION PLAN

During the Asthma Review ask the doctor for a signed written Asthma Action Plan. Schools and Outside School Hours Care will require an up-to-date plan for each student with asthma at the start of the new school year. Evidence tells us that using a written Asthma Action Plan to identify and manage a flare-up sooner can help to reduce hospitalisations, improve lung function and reduce the number of days off school.



## RELIEVER MEDICATION AND SPACER

Check with the school about their medication policy and work with the staff to find the best way to manage your child's asthma medication, including before physical activity (where applicable).

- Make sure your reliever medication is in date with enough medication remaining. If not, purchase a new one
- Purchase a new spacer (and mask if age appropriate) for use at school
- Ensure the pharmacist labels medication with your child's name and you label the spacer with your child's name



#### **TALK TO SCHOOL STAFF**

Make time to talk with the class teacher and the school nurse (where applicable) about your child's asthma, their written Asthma Action Plan and their usual triggers, symptoms and medication.

Also talk to your child's sport coaches and supervisors of other school activities. Don't forget to keep staff up-to-date with any change to your child's asthma management.

Any changes to asthma management throughout the school year, requires an updated written Asthma Action Plan to be completed by your doctor and provided to the school

#### If a child -

- has symptoms during the day more than 2 days per week
- has to stop activities such as playing or exercise because they get asthma symptoms
- wakes up with asthma during the night or early morning
- needs reliever more than 2 days perweek (not including prior to exercise)
  then take your child to their doctor as this indicates signs of worsening asthma.

For the start of school please arrange:

- ⇒ An updated written Asthma Action Plan from your child's doctor
- ⇒ A named spacer and reliever puffer
- ⇒ A planned talk with your child's teacher and school administrators about their asthma
