We also have some events to look forward to this term that I wish to highlight:

#### 20<sup>th</sup> Feb – Year 3-6 Athletics Carnival

After last year's feedback, we have decided to split our Athletics Carnivals into two days. Upper Primary (3-6) on next Tuesday and Early Childhood (K-2) later on in the term. The reason for the split is mostly so that our youngest students can be involved in more races and also the 3-6 carnival needs to happen asap in the year so students can be selected to represent the school at the Circular Head Athletics Carnival on the 26<sup>th</sup> of Feb. This year the Upper Primary carnival will be held at the Little Athletics track from 9:30am – 2pm. More information will be released to allow families to come along on the day to cheer on their children.

#### 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb - Welcome Back BBQ

We will be having a Welcome Back BBQ for our school family on the  $22^{nd}$  of Feb from 5pm – 7pm. This will also the "grand opening" of our new playground. Please contact the school office if you require any additional information.




# Student drop off and pick up Keeping everyone safe!!

Replacement hats are available at the office for \$12




#### **Scholastic Book Club**

#### Reminder to Parents - Students with Asthma

Parents/Guardians of students who are diagnosed with any form of Asthma are required to provide an updated Asthma Action Plan at the start of every year.

#### **Student Medications**

If a student requires medication whilst at school, please discuss with your child's teacher and school administration staff to ensure that school staff are clearly advised on how to administer the medication.

Written permission (Education Department Medication Form) must be provided for any non-prescribed (e.g. Panadol) or prescribed medication to be taken by your child. Medication must be given to the school in its original packaging. The form for prescribed medication must be signed by the doctor or chemist who administers the prescription.

Education Department Medication Forms are available at the school office.

#### **Student Absences**

If your child is away from school for any reason it is important that you contact the school to provide a reason. Information is recorded electronically by the Department for Education to monitor absences. Parents may be required to provide a medical certificate for students who are absent with illnesses for 5 or more days in a calendar year.

## **Asthma Ready for School**



Summer holidays are an important time for kids with asthma

During all the festivities, please don't forget to keep up your child's asthma management and continue to use their asthma medication as prescribed. Good asthma management over the holidays means less time off school when kids return in the new year, and less time off work for you.

To make sure your child stays as healthy as possible over the break and into 2024, you can take the following steps:

- Check your child's medication to make sure they're still in date.
- Keep using your child's preventer medication as directed over the summer holidays, even if they're feeling well.
- If you're leaving the house or going on holiday, make sure you pack your child's asthma medication(s) and a spacer.
- Book an Asthma Review with your doctor to get an updated written Asthma Action Plan during the holidays- you'll need this for Term 1 2023. Book in early as doctors can have limited appointments over the Christmas period.

# For the start of school please arrange:

- ⇒ An updated written Asthma Action Plan from your child's doctor
- ⇒ A named spacer and reliever puffer
- ⇒ A planned talk with your child's teacher and school administrators about their asthma
