Maths in 3/4 Underwood

NAPLAN

With NAPLAN starting this week, I think there is no better time for us to think about its purpose and learn more about it. NAPLAN stands for "National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy" and occurs every year in Australian schools for students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9. This is the 17th year that NAPLAN has been occurring in Australia. The assessments are based on the Australian Curriculum and the results of NAPLAN provide schools with long term planning so that the Literacy and Numeracy programs in the schools continue to improve. While it is an indication of where each individual student is at, it is important to note that tests are not always the best way to assess student learning. As a school we look for



trends in year levels or in aspects of the results that give us feedback on areas that we have strength in and areas that we need to improve. Despite that, the important message for our students and their families is it is only useful for our school if students give their best efforts. This then gives us accurate information. After our first day of NAPLAN today, it is clear that students really are putting their best efforts in. NAPLAN is definitely not something to stress or worry about and we as a school certainly do not apply any pressure to the students other than to encourage them to do their best.

PHONE CALLS

As you would be expecting, the teachers of your children will be making an effort to contact you over the coming weeks. The purpose of this contact is to check in with you to see if you have any queries or want to know more about how your child has settled into their new class-room. It is also a good chance to hear about your child's learning progress and to discuss Learning Plan's if needed. We aim to be very approachable, so please, if there is anything you want to know more about; these phone calls are the perfect way to do this at this time of the year.



ATTENDANCE

One thing that we are working hard on this year is increasing our attendance rates as a school. We believe that the best way to do this is to continue to have engaging learning opportunities in the classroom each day as well as continuing to develop a positive culture in the school that brings about a sense of pride and belonging. Of course, there are good reasons not to attend (illness, appointment etc.), but we really want to eliminate any unnecessary missed days, late days or early leaving. All this time adds up. Our big goal is to have every child at school more than 90% of the time, the research shows that this is the point that attendance rates really have a huge influence on learning. We currently have 45 students in our school who are below 90% and so we really want to work with families to increase this. If there is anything we can do as a school to improve your child's attendance, please let us know.


