Exciting Term 2!

Dear Families,

Well we have well and truly hit the ground running in Term 2, with students straight back into routine. This term's additional events and activities include Cross Country, Mother's Day events, Do it for Dolly Day, Walk Safely to School Day, a visit from Tas Networks (electricians), a Jack Jumpers visit, Simultaneous Story Time, a BMX Trick Bike show, a visit from Friends of Tasmanian Wildlife, a Puppet Theatre performance and some work with CHAC closer to NAIDOC Week. It certainly is an exciting term.

One thing to clarify is that we will be doing two Cross Country Carnivals, one for Early Childhood (Tues 11^{th} June) and one for Upper Primary (Mon 13^{th} May). We found that our Athletic Carnivals worked so much better splitting into two and so have decided to do the same with our Cross Country Carnivals. Both will be in the afternoon timeslots, from 1:30 - 2:30pm.

One announcement that I would like to make is that Mrs Jayde Grey has been successful in applying for our "Support Teacher" role. This role is a full-time position. This increases Mrs Grey's responsibility in our school where she will be organising all of the additional supports in the school so that our students receive the best possible support while at school. These additional supports include, for example, a Social worker, Psychologist, Speech and Language Pathologist, English as an additional language, use of Teacher Assistants, developing learning plans and managing supports for students with disabilities. Mr Smith has been filling this role for the first part of this year. Mrs Grey will not start this role officially until we find a replacement for her Kinder Teaching role. So we are advertising this position currently and this process might take some time. When we do find a suitable replacement, we will transition the class from having Mrs Grey in Kinder to the new teacher smoothly so as to not impact the students learning. Congratulations once again to Mrs Grey.

Lastly, I really want to promote the importance of students having access to learning by increasing their attendance at school. Currently as a whole school, we have an attendance of 92%, so on average this is a really good sign. Research shows, however, that the learning of students who attend less than 9 out of 10 days on average is significantly affected. So we really want our students attending at least 9 out of 10 days or more. Currently we have 59 students who are less than 9/10 days, so we will be working really hard to support those students (and their families) to increase their attendance rate.

All in all, the school has had a calm, settled and productive start to the term. It is clear that we are in for another positive term. 
Walk Safely to School Day
