
# 3-4 Gausden

We learned about the lives of convicts who travelled from the United Kingdom to Australia in 1788.

We created journal entries about convicts, some we made up and some were real. We compiled these into a class book called "Convict Tales from The First Fleet."

This Friday Mrs Jayde Grey will meet with families to support them with information about starting Kinder, including routines, what to expect and some opportunities to ask questions. This will occur in the assembly hall while Mrs Coombe continues with the Pre-Kinder session for the children. Next Friday (the 13<sup>th</sup>) will be the final Pre-Kinder for 2024.

#### **Year 6 Orientation**

Year 6 students will spend this Friday, the 6<sup>th</sup> December having a trial run at being high school students. They will meet the high school staff at the school gym by 8:45am and experience a day in the life of a Year 7 student. Have a fantastic day!

### **Upper Primary Swimming**

Our 3/4 and 5/6 classes launched into their swimming program this week, the participation rates are fantastic and feedback from all staff is our students are learning so much about water safety – keep up the great work! Upper primary swimming will continue until the 13<sup>th</sup> December.

### Looking ahead to 2025

Staffing is almost finalised and will be announced in our final newsletter. We are excited to announce our Kindergarten teachers for 2025 will be Mrs Jayde Grey and Mrs Hayley Sharman. In all other year levels, your children will find out their teacher for 2025 when reports go home on Friday 13th December.

#### **School Data**

Mrs King and I have been reviewing school data and have been so excited to share our progress against the targets set at the start of 2024. Some noteworthy achievements are:

- While our attendance rate didn't quite get to where we wanted, only 2.9% of absences remain unexplained. Thanks especially to Kim for helping us keep on top of communication with families.
- Safe at school Our student wellbeing data tells us we've grown 10% higher in the number of students feeling safe at school. How fantastic!
- Parent survey data also tells us we have very high rates of families feeling their child is safe at school, where our rating is above the state average.
- Staff report feeling high levels of satisfaction relating to meeting the learning need of students.
- 97% students participated in the PAT reading assessment and the growth in all year levels is worthy of celebration.
- The number of students being identified as 'at risk' with their reading has drastically reduced over the year.

Congratulations to our students and staff for their hard work, all year! I'm very proud of every one of you.

## 5-6 Fletcher


Over the last two terms, Year 5/6 Fletcher has had the opportunity to develop their own business – a restaurant. This project was connected to several curriculum areas including English, Maths and HASS. Each learner created an advertising campaign that included, a company logo and slogan, an advertising poster, a grand opening invitation, a signature dish flyer, and a persuasive newspaper article. Along with these elements they also created an opening hours timetable, collected, and presented data to help them develop their business and designed a digital floor plan.

The most recent elements that were added to their portfolios were a series of procedures that could be found in restaurants including a hand washing procedure and a recipe for their signature dish. The final component they will be working on over the last few weeks of term is developing a budget for their business.













### **Key Word Sign**

Key word sign (KWS) is a communication technique that uses speech and sign together to help support children and adults communicate. It is a strategy used for people with communication difficulties to get their message across to others.

KWS provides visual information alongside speech, which can assist visual learners. Learning KWS can help reduce the levels of frustration by a child who can't express their needs and wants.

The key words in a message are signed. KWS is not a sign language, but it borrows the signs from the sign language of the country it is used in.

At Smithton Primary school we are working towards implementing KWS across the whole school.

### Sign of the Week

Learn and use Key Word Sign (KWS) with sign of the week. Try using this sign in different situations, with many people this week. You can also learn other signs.



### help

Place dominant hand bent at third knuckles, palm down, onto nondominant palm. Or may place dominant hand onto non-dominant hand, palms together. Move formation forward. \* With directionality.

### What you might say when using this sign:

Let me help you. Will you help me? Let's help each other.

### What is KWS?

KWS is a type of Alternative and Augmentative Communication (AAC). It is a strategy to support people with communication difficulties. KWS borrows signs from the local sign language. In Australia, this is Auslan.

### How do I use KWS?

- 1. Sign and talk at the same time
- 2. Sign the key words while saying the whole sentence
- 3. Use other visual strategies:
  - o body language
  - o natural gestures
  - facial expression
  - o directionality and placement (sign production features used in Auslan)
  - o some finger spelling

As a result of a recent stocktake in our library we have some books which have been cleared from the shelves. This is a great opportunity to get your child/children some books for the holidays.


The books are located in the Family Room and have a cancelled sticker on them. Please feel free to help yourself to these books at pick-up time or if you are popping in to school.
