The connection between student learning outcomes and family relationships with school is undeniable. It's no coincidence that our data is showing our learning achievements and engagement are continuing to improve when we see the fantastic support systems our students have.

Our achievement against our school targets clearly tells us the hard work of students, staff and family is paying off in a range of areas. The most noteworthy improvements to share would be the increasing number of students with high achievements across different curriculum areas, as well as the large numbers of growth in literacy and numeracy. It's been very exciting to read student reports to see the outstanding effort everyone is putting into their learning. All our school data shows us we are on track with the state's reading priority.

Our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Survey tells us our students feel safe and supported at school, with this sentiment also reflected in our family and staff satisfaction surveys. We are well above the state average when it comes to responses to questions like:






Asthma Ready for School



Summer holidays are an important time for kids with asthma

During all the festivities, please don't forget to keep up your child's asthma management and continue to use their asthma medication as prescribed. Good asthma management over the holidays means less time off school when kids return in the new year, and less time off work for you.

To make sure your child stays as healthy as possible over the break and into 2024, you can take the following steps:

- Check your child's medication to make sure they're still in date.
- Keep using your child's preventer medication as directed over the summer holidays, even if they're feeling
- If you're leaving the house or going on holiday, make sure you pack your child's asthma medications and a

- Book an Asthma Review with your doctor to get an updated written Asthma Action Plan during the holidaysyou'll need this for Term 1 2023. Book in early as doctors can have limited appointments over the Christmas period.

BACK TO SCHOOL... IS YOUR CHILD **ASTHMA READY?**

Every year there is a rise in asthma flare-ups when children return to school after the summer holidays This results in an increase in Emergency Department visits, hospitalisations and days off school.

MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS ASTHMA READY BY FOLLOWING THESE STEPS:

BOOK AN ASTHMA REVIEW (LONG APPOINTMENT)

This is a special check-up for your child's asthma recent asthma control, symptoms, summer and back to school triggers, and medicine use. Don't forget to include a check on their device technique.



UPDATE YOUR CHILD'S ASTHMA ACTION PLAN

During the <u>Asthma Review</u> ask the doctor for a signed <u>written Asthma Action Plan</u>. Schools and Outside School Hours Care will require an up-to-date plan for each student with asthma at the start of the new school year. Evidence tells us that using a written Asthma Action Plan to identify and manage a flare-up sooner can help to reduce hospitalisations, improve lung function and reduce the number of days off school



RELIEVER MEDICATION AND SPACER

Check with the school about their medication policy and work with the staff to find the best way to manage your child's asthma medication, including before physical activity (where applicable).

- Make sure your reliever medication is in date with enough medication remaining. If not, purchase a new one
- Purchase a new spacer (and mask if age appropriate) for use at school
- Ensure the pharmacist labels medication with your child's name and you label the spacer with your child's name



TALK TO SCHOOL STAFF

Make time to talk with the class teacher and the school nurse (where applicable) about your child's asthma, their written Asthma Action Plan and their usual triggers, symptoms and medication.

Also talk to your child's sport coaches and supervisors of other school activities. Don't forget to keep staff up-to-date with any change to your child's asthma management.

Any changes to asthma management throughout the school year, requires an updated vritten Asthma Action Plan to be completed by your doctor and provided to the school

- has to stop activities such as playing or exercise because they get asthma symptoms
- wakes up with asthma during the night or early morning
- then take your child to their doctor as this indicates signs of worsening asthma-

For the start of school please arrange:

- ⇒ An updated written Asthma Action Plan from your child's doctor
- ⇒ A named spacer and reliever
- ⇒ A planned talk with your child's teacher and school administrators about their asthma
