Year 1-2 Goodwin won the K-2 Class Challenge at the Science Gig on Monday night!

In 1/2 Goodwin we spent the first three weeks exploring planets, making models and writing about our Solar System to be ready for the Science Gig that was held on Monday night.

We have learnt all about the planets and mapped out how far they are all from the Sun, converting it to metres so we could measure our Solar System outside. We researched planets through books and the internet and found some amazing facts that we did not know. We were lucky when 5/6 Fletcher came and shared their learning with us to deepen our knowledge. We learnt the difference between planets and dwarf planets, then started to make our planets using paper mâché.





We finally had our models finished and then completed posters where we shared what we learnt with the Circular Head Community.














Term Three so far at Smithton Primary School



Families are reminded to return RFDS Dentist forms - spares are available at the office if needed. Thank you for your continued involvement and support - it makes all the difference!



Preschool Outcomes Measure - Kindergarten

Our school will be participating in a trial of a new tool called the Preschool Outcomes Measure. This tool is designed to help teachers better understand a child's learning and development in kindergarten. It focuses on a child's language and problem-solving skills.

The trial is part of a National Applied Trial being conducted in schools across all states and territories, aimed at improving educational outcomes for children in the year before full-time school.

Only some kindergarten children may be invited to take part in the trial. If chosen, your child will participate in a range of familiar classroom activities as part of the process.

If you do not wish for your child to be included in the National Applied Trial, please return the 'Opt-out form' to your child's teacher by Friday 15 August. If our school does not receive this form from you by this date, your child may be included in the trial.



EXPLORING Our Bodies in Kinder Grey



Learning About Our Amazing Bodies!

This week in Kinder Grey, we've been exploring one of our favourite topics — *our bodies*! From our heads to our toes, the children are discovering all the amazing things our bodies can do. We've been learning the names of different body parts, talking about how we use them every day, and even singing fun songs like "Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Toes!"

Through hands-on activities, drawings, and stories, students are beginning to understand how their bodies help them move, think, breathe, and grow. We also started talking about how to keep our bodies healthy—like eating good food, staying active, and getting plenty of rest.

So far, we've been focusing on two important parts: our eyes and our mouth.

We explored how our **eyes** help us see the world around us — from colours and shapes to people and places. We talked about how blinking keeps our eyes clean and how each of us has unique eye colours!

Next, we learned about our **mouth** — how we use it to talk, eat, smile, and even sing! We had fun looking in mirrors to see our teeth, tongue, and lips, and discussed how we can take care of our mouths by brushing our teeth and eating healthy foods.

The children have been very curious and excited to share what they've learned. Ask your child what they see with their eyes that makes them happy, or what their favourite healthy snack is for their mouth!



Our class have been learning about information texts and were given an opportunity to research an area of interest to them. They then used this information to create wonderful dioramas.








